Letter to Families regarding Covid-19

Dear NRCC applicants and families,

Please find below the safety protocols that will be followed at camp regarding Covid-19. As we get closer to camp, our Covid guidelines may change. The staff at NRCC will make every effort to provide a safe environment for your student while under our care. Last year's camp was very successful, and we experienced no Covid-related interruptions at all. If you have specific questions, feel free to contact the Director.

Vaccines

Students attending the 2022 Natural Resources Careers Camp will not be required to be vaccinated. However, we do strongly encourage that all campers consult with their family physician and consider getting vaccinated before camp starts. If you get the vaccine, please let Director Oldham know and bring a copy of your vaccination card to camp.

Testing

All campers will need to be tested at least 72 hours prior to arriving to camp and bring proof of a negative test. If you test positive, please contact Director Oldham immediately as you will not be permitted to attend NRCC.

Face Coverings

All campers will need to bring enough masks to wear for the week. Masks should completely cover your mouth and nose and will always be worn indoors except while at meals.

Daily Health Survey

All campers and staff will have their temperature taken each morning and will fill out a health survey on symptoms each morning. If at any time you begin to feel sick or feverish, contact the Director immediately.

We look forward to seeing you in Garrett County this July. Therefore, in the weeks leading up to NRCC, please take every precaution to avoid situations that could put you at risk for Covid-19. We don't want anyone to miss this amazing week full of great experiences.
